FYTCMA Officers' Meeting October 14, 2011 Polk State College - Lakeland Campus

Bill Hemme was mentioned as a central contact. We discussed the choice between a program or retreat as the format. Most seemed to feel that we needed to bring back "retreat" as part of the title.

Don Ransford recommended that our flag be formed as a banner.

We were reminded that the slate of possible officers is to be nominated by the President-Elect.

The meeting was adjourned for lunch and the fall retreat.
